NBEF Introduces the Alan Davis Shining Stars

The NorthBranford Education Foundation is proud to present the 2018 class of Alan Davis Shining Stars. The award was named after the legendary Principal at NBIS who passed away this past year. "Alan was an inspiration to us all and I can't think of a better way to honor his memory than to name this award after him," said Foundation president Frank Mentone.

The award is given to people who have had a positive impact on the North Branford community. The honorees this year are as follows:



John Calamita has been a part of the North Branford community throughout his entire life. For the past 44 years, he has been especially involved in the lives of many of our families through the gift of music, serving as the organist/music director at the Parish of St. Augustine.

During the past few years, with the combining of St. Monica and St. Augustine to form the Parish of St Ambrose, John has also had the opportunity to serve our community in the Northford section of town.

John has led and volunteered with numerous programs and projects that have benefited our youth and community. His association with St. Augustine Knights of Columbus Council 9921, along with his employment by the Town of North Branford at Public Works, has allowed him to assist others by repairing or building ramps and entrances for

physically challenged residents to access their homes, along with being part of the team that constructed the Northford Pavillion and High School concession stand buildings.

Giving to others through "time, talent and treasure" has been a big part of his life. It is in service to others through music and active community participation that has made John a "Shining Star" in our town.

John resides in Northford with his wife Sandra and has three beautiful children, John Peter, Evangalese and Michael.



Kathy Granfield attended West Haven public schools and did her undergraduate work at UConn, majoring in pre-veterinary medicine. Through a UConn science exchange program, she spent her senior year studying animal and environmental science in Rouen (Normandy), France. Two graduate degrees followed, one in environmental science and a second in science education. In 1994, Kathy took her first classroom job, teaching biology and environmental science at the Hyde Leadership School, one of New Haven's magnet high schools. After 8 years teaching in New Haven, Kathy joined the North

Branford school system, and has been teaching 8th grade general science at NBIS ever since. During her time in North Branford, Kathy has served on multiple committees, including character education, school security, and curriculum development. Currently she is serving on a committee that is working to develop a new strategy to inspire student driven community service projects for the 8th grade.

Outside of school, a desire to help injured veterans recover from both physical and psychological injuries led her to create Veteran Angler Charters, a federally recognized non-profit which takes injured servicemen and women out on free charter fishing trips. A licensed USCG captain since 2007, she created a fishing program that uses a different approach from traditional recreational therapy, working with small groups only, with health care providers on board to provide assistance as necessary. With two colleagues at NBIS (Debbie Stone and Robert Hibson) helping with the start-up, VAC began with just one captain and one boat (Kathy) and has since spread to four states and five boats, providing free therapeutic trips to hundreds of veterans all over New England. The program has received multiple local, regional, and one national award for its work with injured veterans. Kathy frequently shares her community service adventures and challenges with her students, hoping to inspire them to use their own unique gifts and talents to find a way to reach out to those in need.



Lou Paternoster has been a resident of North Branford for thirty three years. He and his wife Betty Jo have three children Brittany, 33, Nick, 27 and Hailey 24, who all went through the North Branford school system. He also has three puggles - Derby, Miley and Tyson.

Lou has been active in the community for many years. He is currently a part timer at the North Branford Recreation Center and a greeter at Walmart.

He has been involved in North Branford Youth Basketball for more than twenty five years where he has been a four year president, four year vice president, 15 year

board member, boys and girls travel coach for fifteen years rec coach for fifteen years and currently has been refereeing for fourteen years.

He was a board member of the North Branford Little League for fifteen years where he has been a Little League and Babe Ruth coach and has been umpiring for 10 and he currrently serves as the unpire-in -chiel for both softball and baseball.

Lou has also served on the Board of Directors for youth soccer, He was a eight year board member, where he served as president for four years, travel coach for ten, NBIS girls soccer coach for 6 years and the NBHS JV coach for one year.

He also served on the Board of Education where he was the Chairperson for two years, and he has been a twelve year parking attenda nt for the Potato Festival.



Cliff Potter was born and raised in North Guilford. In 1965 Cliff graduated Guilford High School and went onto Connecticut School of Electronics. In 1967 he enlisted in the US Army and served in Vietnam from 1968-69. After serving three years of active military duty Cliff continued his military service in the Army National Guard and Air National Guard for a total of 33 years. Cliff married his wife, Dolly, who is from Northford in 1970. They raised their children, Pamela, Daniel and Robin in town. Cliff worked for SNET for nearly 40 years and is now enjoy-

ing retirement. His love for the military and veterans continues today. Cliff serves as a member of the City of New Haven Veterans Affairs Advisory Committee. This Committee organizes and implements the Memorial Day and Veterans Day events in New Haven. Cliff is also the chairman of the 103rd ACS Alumni group, Air National Guard retirees that meet four times a year.

Cliff began speaking in North Branford Intermediate School (NBIS) when his wife, Dolly, a paraprofessional in Carol Papa's history class asked him to come speak. He still visits around Veteran's Day when he brings in uniforms, MREs, helmets, gas mask safety equipment for the students to try. In recent years Cliff has been invited to speak to the students by Kathy Granfield, science teacher at NBIS. He talks to the students about his military service in Vietnam as well as his stateside service. He explains the benefits of military life and how it applies to work ethics and work skills in civilian life. Alan Davis was a big supporter of Cliff's visits and always welcomed him. Alan would often sit in on his presentations.

One of Cliff's favorite memories as a boy was working on his neighbor's farm. In recent years Cliff served on the Town's Agricultural Commission as the first chairman. The commission was formed to promote farming in North Branford. He served for five years on that commission. He along with others has helped bring antique tractor pulling to our town which has been a huge success. One of the pulls takes place during our annual Potato and Corn Festival (POCO). Cliff and his crew of hard working volunteers started hayrides during the Potato Festival and it has been a big hit. The smiles on the kid's faces who have never seen a tractor and hay wagon is worth everything to Cliff. He now does them at the Town Christmas Tree Lighting and the line is endless. "Bringing a little joy to families for the holidays if what it is all about." If you don't see Cliff at a tractor pull or hayride you may have seen him at a Town Council or Board of Education Meeting. He loves our little town, speaks his mind; always polite and gracious. EDITORIAL

State Representative Vincent Candelora **Repatriation: Connecticut's Massive Revenue Gain**




If you haven't figured it out, the part-time position of state representative is now yearround. The budget process feels like a neverending roller coaster ride, and this week just added another curve to that ride. You may have read about Connecticut receiving a \$900 million bump in revenue at year end. As we struggle to prevent tax increases and

right-size government, we may have some reprieve with this new revenue source. Before this revenue gets incorporated into the budget, however, we need to understand its source.

In 2008, the federal government passed the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008. Internal Revenue Code 457a requires all hedge fund managers to report offshore deferred fees as income no later than December 31, 2017. Historically, hedge fund companies were able to divert the receipt of these management fees that were charged by having the payments be made to offshore accounts; the Cayman Islands come to mind. These offshore funds grew tax free for up to ten years through 2017. Because the management companies typically elected to be a "cash-basis taxpayers", the companies did not recognize the taxable income until the cash actually was transferred to the United States. The law essentially required these funds to be transferred back to the United States and be recognized as taxable income by 2017. Naturally, these companies and individuals waited until the last minute to transfer these funds, and as a result, Connecticut recognized a windfall on December 31, 2017. Our new challenge is to understand what portion constitutes one-time revenue, and what portion reflects additional tax revenue on an ongoing basis. On January 15, quarterly estimated incomes taxes are due and will serve as an indicator.

The Governor and some legislators have asked that we ignore this revenue and continue to make cuts or increase taxes to account for our current year deficit of \$220 million. I believe we need to take a wait and see approach. In one week, we will have a better picture of Connecticut's revenue. If in fact, this off-shore loophole is permanently closed, Connecticut will realize more

revenue annually. In addition, by statute, I don't believe the Governor has the authority to continually declare a deficit and permit himself to make cuts and hold funding back when revenues are sufficient to cover the budget expenditures. Regardless, we need to tread carefully. As the stock market improves and these loopholes are closed, Connecticut may be positioned for better fiscal times ahead, but that money must be used wisely, because our unfunded liabilities continue to outpace any

Ice Age? In North America these immense glaciers extended beyond New York and Wisconsin and were more than 2000 feet thick. Then, within the course of less than 2000 years, these glaciers disappeared, melting back to the nether regions of Alaska and Greenland, causing great flooding and further extinction of many of the life forms that had managed to survive the freeze.

There were no humans to blame for this sudden and intense warming. There is no evidence of any meteor impact to plain either the sudden freezing or subsequent thaw


So, do we have some reason to expect that the forces at work 15,000 years ago are no longer relevant to our existence? Or, perhaps we should begin to come to grips with these far greater forces and anticipate our need to adapt to the grandscale climactic impact of such truly Earth-changing events. At a minimum, a real understanding of these grand forces might allow humankind to move inland in anticipation of floods or to more temperate zones in anticipation of global cooling. Or is there another agenda?



Preschool Role Model Screening Project PRIDE is a special education preschool located at Jerome Harrison

Project PRIDE is a special education preschool located at Jerome Harrison School, North Branford, CT. The program incorporates children without disabilities to model appropriate social, language and play skills within preschool activities. This program meets four days a week (Monday through Thursday) with two sessions (morning 9:00-11:30, afternoon 12:45-3:15). The program is seeking three and four-year-old children with typically-developing skills to serve as role models in our classes for the 2018-2019 school year.

To be enrolled as a role model peer, children must pass a preschool screening which assesses cognitive, speech-language, motor and social skills. Role model peers must be toilet trained. If parents are interested, please contact Mrs. Kohler at

203-484-1235, to schedule a screening appointment. The screening will take approximately 30 minutes.

The names of children who pass the screening will be placed in a lottery that will take place in February or as soon as enough candidates have applied. Parents will be notified by phone in February if their child is selected. Children who are selected will participate at no cost. However, transportation must be provided by the parent.

In order for a child to be registered in Kindergarten, the following requirements must be met:

- 1. Child must be five (5) years of age on or before January 1, 2019.
- 2. The birth record or other evidence of the child's age has been examined by the principal or designee.
- 3. Your child must have a current physical exam date; one that was completed after August 28, 2017. The physician and the parent must complete the blue Health Assessment Record provided by the school. This form must be filed with the school <u>prior</u> to the first day of Kindergarten unless alternative arrangements have been made with the building principal.
- 4. Proof of residency has been examined and approved by principal or designee such as: deed to home or dated rental agreement, escrow papers or signed mortgage commitment, current utility or telephone bill, and/or notarized letter from landlord or owner acknowledging parent/guardian's <u>and</u> student's residence.

In addition, if you have specific concerns about your preschool child's development, please call (203) 484-1235, for further information.

In the event of a school cancellation due to inclement weather, day and evening registration will be held on Thursday, February 8, 2018 at the same times noted above.
