

State Representative Vincent Candelora Protecting Election Integrity:

Why No-Excuse Absentee Voting Raises Concerns



Ensuring election integrity is essential, which is why the proposed expansion of absentee voting on this year's ballot raises serious concerns.

In November, voters statewide will decide whether to amend the state constitution to allow all voters to cast absentee ballots. The question presented, however, is vague and fails to mention "no-excuse" absentee voting directly. This

ambiguity could open the door for lawmakers to enact sweeping changes, such as mailing ballots to all registered voters, without meaningful public input—an approach that compromises election security.

Connecticut's election system is already vulnerable, as seen in recent incidents like ballot box drop box stuffing in Bridgeport and the most recent allegations of an immigrant who was misled into registering to vote and obtaining an absentee ballot in Bridgeport. Why expand absentee voting when we haven't yet resolved the flaws in the current system? In 2022, a race in Southington was decided by a single vote, illustrating the potential impact of problems posed by even small vulnerabilities in our election system.

Republicans have proposed commonsense safeguards, such as requiring photo ID and verifying signatures on absentee ballots, but these reforms have been consistently blocked. Early this year, as the stomach-turning Bridgeport controversy unfolded, our colleagues across the aisle rejected an obvious and necessary deterrent: mandatory jail time for criminal election violations. It's hard to believe that security will suddenly become a priority if this measure passes.

We've seen this pattern before. A vague ballot question on early voting led to 14 days of early voting, creating logistical challenges for municipalities with little voter turnout. Republicans offered a more practical three-day alternative, but Democrats forced through the longer plan that costs municipalities—and property taxpayers—more money.

While voting access is important, it should not come at the expense of public trust in elections. The proposal on this year's ballot shifts too much control to one party who control the legislative agenda, leaving voters with no guarantee that the system will be secure. Most people want easier access to the voting booth, but should this ballot measure pass, Connecticut must consider a more balanced approach, like Massachusetts, where voters must request their mail-in ballots, rather than third party special interest groups requesting and distributing thousands of applications.

Voters should think carefully about the risks of no-excuse absentee voting before making this critical decision. The integrity of our elections depends on it.

To cast their votes for Presidential and Vice-Presidential electors, United States Senator, Representative in Congress, State Senator, State Representative, and Registrar of Voters.

To vote on the following question for the approval or disapproval of a proposed Amendment to the Constitution of Connecticut, a vote of "Yes" being a vote for approval, and a vote of "No" being a vote for disapproval: Shall the Constitution of the State be amended to permit the General

Assembly to allow each voter to vote by absentee ballot?

The full text of such proposed question with explanatory text, printed in accordance with Sec. §2-30a of the General Statutes, is available at the Town Clerk's Office for public distribution.

The vote on the proposed question is taken pursuant to the Constitution of Connecticut.

Important Dates for the Fall

The Leaf Drop-Off is open on Saturdays until 11/23, 9-3 Electronics Collection at Public Works – Saturday 11-2 Bulky Waste Pickup – week of November 4th.

Happy Halloween!

Please remember that most of those candy bar wrappers and bags go into the trash. They are not plastic film and they are not recyclable.

When your pumpkin has lost its decorating use, you can throw it into the woods or backyard to feed the wildlife. Make a squirrel very happy. Be sure to remove any non-organic features.

Dead potted plants are compostable. You can put them into your backyard compost pile.

North Branford Fall Leaf Drop-Off Location is open on Saturdays, 9-3.

North Branford residents can bring their leaves to the leaf drop off center located to the left of the old police station, near the Public Works Facility on Route 22 from 9am to 3pm. Just follow the signs. No brush or grass clippings. The leaf drop off will be open on Saturdays October 26th and November 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd. Please place leaves in biodegradable leaf bags (no tape please) or empty them loose onto the ground.

There will be a curbside pickup of leaves in untapped biodegradable paper bags the weeks of December 2^{nd} – December 13^{th}

Hazwaste Central will be closing on October 26th

Located at RWA at 90 Sargent Drive in New Haven, HazWaste Central is open from 9 a.m. until noon on Saturdays only. Household hazardous waste comes from everyday products used in the home, garage, yard or garden. A visit to HazWaste Central is quick and easy. Participants never have to leave their cars, and the waste is off-loaded by professionals. Some of the household wastes that can be dropped off include aerosol cleaners and sprays, antifreeze, oil-based paint and pool chemicals. We also list some of the accepted items on your orange trash information card.

The event will be held at Public Works from 9am to noon. Take2 Recycling will be collecting electronics such as TVs, computers, small appliances and almost anything that has a plug. They cannot accept smoke detectors, A/C's or dehumidifiers.

We will also be taking MATTRESSES (clean and dry), BATTERIES and USED OIL for FREE.

There is a small fee for recycling **PROPANE TANKS** in reusable condition and **TIRES**.

The above items should not be taken by the Bulky Waste pick-up.

When you bring us your mattress, you are creating jobs for those who take them apart to recycle the components.




